


the Holiday Season and 2016 from the Board of Directors, and all Friends.

It is presented by each organization in alternate years, to honour a volunteer's significant contribution to supporting Staff in their work. The Friends of the Museums selected Barb Smith as the 2015 recipient of the award.

Barb Smith has been an active member of the South Mississauga community for over 25 years, both personally and professionally She is well known as the Corporate Social Responsibility Coordinator at CRH Group Canada Inc., previously Holcim (Canada) Inc., where she has facilitated the volunteer efforts of many CRH employees in heritage related activities. Also in her corporate role, she has arranged major annual financial sponsorships for community events at the Museums in particular.

Barb is a very active member of our Board of Directors, participating enthusiastically in all our volunteer fund-raising activities through the seasons, works with the Communications and Membership Committee, and has chaired our Gala Committee for 6 consecutive years. Under her leadership, the gala proceeds have increased from \$8,000 in 2010 to over \$22,000 in 2015. Barb's time and effort on behalf of heritage in Mississauga is reflective of her personal values and commitment to our community. It's not just her job. The hours and hours of evenings and weekends that she generously gives to ensure the continuance of the Museums of Mississauga is reflective of her personal commitment to heritage, for the benefit of all.

# **SKYNNER CUP PRESENTATION**

On November 9, Friends joined Museums Staff, the Museums of Mississauga Advisory Committee, and several dignitaries at Holcim Waterfront Estate, for the official unveiling of the Skynner Cup. Mayor Bonnie Crombie, Consul General of Malta, Charles Sultana, Councillor Karen Ras (Ward 2) and Councillor John Kovac (Ward 4) along with Trish and David Jarvis (descendant of Captain John Skynner) enjoyed a wine reception and Maltese delicacies.

The Skynner Cup is a commemorative silver cup gifted to British Royal Navy Commander John Skynner by the Maltese in the 1800's. The Cup was given to Skynner for his efforts in protecting Malta during the Napoleonic wars from 1796 to 1815. The Skynner family lived in the Anchorage House which in now on the Bradley Museum site, from 1830-1890.

In 2015, the garden simultaneously taught contemporary sustainable gardening practices, and created an active heirloom garden in a heritage setting. The project was in collaboration with Compass Food Bank, Cloverleaf Garden Club and the Friends of the Museums, who provided conceptualization, implementation and maintenance of the garden with the Museums of Mississauga staff. The food produced was gifted to the Compass Food Bank. Fencing installation was completed by Lawn Works, and a Butterfly Garden was added, compliments of the Mississauga Parks Department.

### Question # 2 – November 2015

Does Mississauga really need a Citywide Museum?

## Reply



This is a topical question as the Culture Division is undertaking a strategic planning process to look at how our Museums can "best grow and maintain audiences by utilizing existing assets, while building community demand for a future purpose built museum or related museum experience." On December 14<sup>th</sup> the draft recommendations for the Museums and Heritage Strategic Plan will be presented at the Central Library, Noel Ryan Auditorium at 6:00 pm. Do come!

Back to the question. Let's first review our current Museums. In reality they are historic houses, gems in their own right and something of which to be very proud. We need to continue to preserve them and keep finding new ways to use them and encourage more and more residents to visit. This in itself is a big, worthwhile job and a vital one. It requires commitment from staff and volunteers alike. But, (and isn't there always a but?) – Benares, Bradley and Leslie Log House are not ideally suited to be or to become a citywide "Museum". Their locations are not ideal, their exhibit, event and storage space is limited, and because they are historic houses it is difficult to take full advantage of new technologies.

So does Mississauga need a Citywide Museum?

To rephrase the question; do the residents of Mississauga need a Citywide Museum? Any city institution needs to meet the needs of its residents. A city museum (whoever funds it) "belongs" to the residents. A Museum is more than just a place. What happens in that space and how the residents use that space is just as important.

So, do we need a museum that tells the stories of Mississauga; and sheds light on why so many waves of immigrants have come to the area over the years? A museum that shows how the residents of Mississauga change the city, and how the city changes the residents? A museum that is adaptable and can be used for exhibits and community events? A museum that celebrates our differences but reveals what makes us all Mississaugans? A museum that takes advantage of 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> century technologies? A museum that is easily accessible to all? A museum that gives all residents and their families a sense of place both historically and now?

Do we need a museum that will make us even more proud of our city? I think so. What about you?
