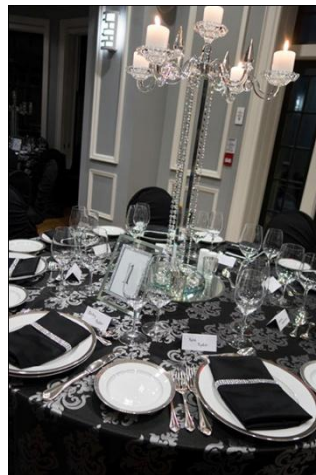

When the carpet and a few strips of the hardwood were lifted, the original painted pattern of the floor boards was revealed.

The floor boards have been repaired, and the painted triangles pattern has been renewed.

The floor is now authentic to 1918.

Notes from MOMAC

I would like to thank the Friends of the Museums of Mississauga for the opportunity to share some updates from the Museums of Mississauga Advisory Committee (MOMAC). As you know MOMAC and Friends are closely related and share the same passion and commitment to the well-being and advancement of our Museums. However MOMAC's focus is slightly different; we are a committee of Council charged with advising the City on the Museums direction and strategy. I hope these brief notes are the beginning of a series which will keep everyone engaged in what we are doing.

Last year the City Council slightly changed our mandate as follows:

The Museums of Mississauga Advisory Committee (MOMAC) will provide input, guidance and support to the Manager, Museums and Traditions regarding the artifact collection and the future city-wide museum as a Committee of Council.

Just let that sink in."the future city-wide museum". What does that actually mean?

As yet there are no firm plans and there is much work to do by everyone connected with the Museums. City staff are planning to start an engagement process with the citizens of Mississauga to get a better feel for what is wanted and how we can move forward. But even though it is early in the process, we have a clear statement of intent. As part of the Cultural Master Plan, the City of Mississauga is seriously considering how best to provide a city-wide museum. This new museum will not replace the wonderful jewels we have in Benares, Bradley and Leslie, but it will enhance what we can do, and create another way to engage more and more people in our community.

As we move forward, we will all need to be persuasive, and we will need to demonstrate a city wide enthusiasm for a new Museum. This project will need support from citizens, politicians and businesses if it is going to come to fruition. (In a future note, I will discuss how we can all help in generating that momentum). I hope you're all as excited by this as I am; it's a fantastic opportunity that we must turn into firm plans!

I look forward to sharing more of my thoughts with you in the next edition, and I would encourage you to contact me with any thoughts that you may have.
