

On Friday, October 24th, 2014 Arthur Harris and his family hosted "The Rally" at Benares Historic House (one of the Museums of Mississauga) as part of Heritage Mississauga's 13th Annual "Haunted Mississauga" Heritage Tour. Over twenty neighbours joined in welcoming almost one hundred visitors who took the six interactive tours running from 7PM to 9PM and enjoyed the great weather, fun and hot cider!

The story took place in October of 1914. The First World War had already begun, and young men from the community had begun to enlist. The news is simple: the Empire needs more men. Many more. Two recruiters are trying to rally support and encourage, or coerce, volunteers to enlist. However, even as the community is gathering to hear the recruiters and wish their young men well, it is evident that there are dissenters in the mix and that not everyone supports the war. The question facing the young men of the community, and their families, is simple: will you go or will you stay? Will you rally and support the Empire?

As the recruiters asked visitors to enlist, Arthur and his family and noble guests explained the family's involvement in the Napoleonic wars, the Boer wars, the Fenian raids and World War I. Official Red Cross sock patterns were distributed and everyone was encouraged to knit socks for the troops. Finished projects are to be returned to Benares for distribution to the troops.

"The Rally" was quite a success and plans are being made to celebrate victory after the war is over, at Benares Historic House. Surely the war will be short and the troops will be home for Christmas!

Good Things Come To Those Who Wait

My mother always taught me that good things come to those who wait. In the case of the development of a purpose-built museum and artifact collection centre, the people of Mississauga will be, one day, hopefully soon, greatly rewarded. Because we have certainly waited a long time.

It is not as if we are wanting a museum per se because between Benares Historic House, Bradley Museum and Leslie Log House a fine, rich and diverse programme has been developed. These three sites are constantly bustling with musical, theatrical, and historical interpretation events. Whether it has been Shakespeare in the open among the stars as evidenced in the summer at the Leslie Log House and the Bradley Museum site, or the ever popular music events that take place On the Verandah of Benares every Friday night each summer. The teas, the art exhibitions, Halloween and Christmas events as well as the flipping of pancakes in March with the Maple Magic festival. The recent Doors Open event that hosted a World War One battle re-enactment with the fly-over of vintage fighting airplanes demonstrated all that our current museum sites offer.

In their current state, our museums, aided by the Friends of the Museums and overseen by the Museums of Mississauga staff, have offered a plethora of services and events that have catered to all in Mississauga. Attendance keeps growing and visitors have indicated quite clearly that they are satisfied with the experiences they have had on these museum sites.

So what more can we want? Well, there is a lot more that is expected. First of all, we continue to run out of space for our artifact collections. We need a home, preferably a centralized location where we can house and store the great artifacts that will be held in trust to preserve our past. So that our future residents can understand how this great city was built, and also have opportunity to understand the people who founded and lived in the city.

Secondly, we need to develop the one thing that many other cities and communities have: a purpose-built museum site that can showcase the artifacts all under one roof. The focus of the museum will be to celebrate our city. To document and demonstrate how it was built. To showcase the amazing, talented and skilled individuals who founded and lived in this city. To celebrate their lives and achievements. It will have the unique perspective of showcasing the history of Mississauga from 1939 to the present day, but also honour the many artifacts in our collection that pre-date this formative time.

Mississauga is now Canada's sixth largest city. All the other large cities in Canada have developed museums that celebrate the development of their city, or are in the process of developing a municipal museum. It is equally important to have our own distinctive museum centre that tells the story of our great city. Mississauga is a large and vibrant municipality that is now comprised of a diverse population that contributes greatly to the economic, social and cultural mosaic of Canada. The citizens of the city deserve to have a home to honour the establishment of Mississauga and the contribution our citizens have made to the rest of the world. This is the city that after all was the home of such luminaries as Colonel Harland Saunders, Igor Gouzenko, Silken Laumann, Don Cherry, Oscar Peterson, Mazo de la Roche, and yes, newly retired Hazel McCallion to name but just a few who have gained international fame.

That is why it is so important to support the effort to develop a purpose-built museum and artifact collection centre to tell the story of Mississauga and demonstrate that indeed, as my mother did say, "good things come to those who wait".




