

Following are excerpts from the Exhibit Report compiled by Stuart Keeler: Chief Curator | Manager, Museums & Traditions – Arts & Culture, City of Mississauga.

The Museums of Mississauga are proud to partner with the residents of our City to showcase collections, ideas and concepts relevant to Mississauga, 905 and Peel region communities. We serve to present an exceptional collection of historic house museums with the goal to create a meaningful dialogue on a shared past, a collective present and a collaborative future. By presenting relevant exhibitions, educational programs and innovative engagement experiences, the museums connect the public with the story of Mississauga's heritage shaped by Canadian identity and our global context.

The exhibit **Wrapped, Tied and Tucked** at the **Anchorage and Benares Visitor Centre** generated great interest and feedback from across Mississauga. The exhibition included a partnership with Artist Tazeen Qayyum and Sampradaya Dance Creations. The Opening VIP Night featured a memorable performance at Benares Historic House – on the front verandah the traditional Bharhamyham dance of Southern India. **The exhibit included community engagement with the loan of private collections:** Mayor Crombie, Meena Chopra, Asma Mahmood, Lata Prata, and Deepali Dewan. **Institutional loans were in collaboration with:** The Royal Ontario Museum (ROM), The Textile Museum of Canada (TMC), and Ryerson University Fashion Research Collection.

Onsite Programming: Artist Talk with Collectors of South Asian Fabric, Worn Stories Symposium, ROM Family Camera Project, and with South Asian Collections curator Deepali Dewan.

Off Site Programming: The Skynner Cup with Mayor Crombie, Counsel General of Malta, Councillor John Kovac, Councillor Karen Ras and the Maltese Society of Mississauga, Maltese Association of Toronto and the Friends of the Museums, MOMAC and community members.
