# THAT'S A WRAP! REPORT FOR THE VERANDAH - 2018

The Friends of the Museums of Mississauga, On the Verandah concert series celebrated its 15th consecutive season of concerts at beautiful Benares this summer. For 14 summer evenings, local residents enjoyed a tranquil evening on the lawn, listening to a wide variety of musical talents. Some of our performers enjoy our venue so much that they return season after season, creating new and ever fresh renditions for our enjoyment.

This fundraising event, as with all FRIENDS activities, is designed to help and support the Museums of Mississauga. The "pay as you wish" collection, after sharing with our performers, is directed to our ongoing bus program. This encourages Peel schools to apply for free busses to transport students to the Museums for their academic programmes, which share with students the cultural history of our neighbourhood. Over the years, hundreds of children have benefitted from this "hands on" experience.

In addition, OTV gives local performers a venue for their talents and an opportunity to share their love of music with an appreciative audience. Each year, we have performers choosing to return again and again. A couple have been with us for each of the 15 years and several have performed for four, five or even six years, despite their busy calendars. We are grateful for their enthusiasm and continued support.

Each year our numbers grow. The obvious enjoyment and appreciative comments from the local residents encourage us. They show us that On the Verandah is a well-received & valuable service. Benares provides an oasis of quiet relaxation on Friday evenings. What could better than sitting beneath shady trees as the music plays, letting your cares fade away?

Mississauga Cement Plant Open House September 22, 2018



In September, a group of Friends members attended an Open House hosted by CRH here in Mississauga. CRH Canada has been a generous supporter of Friends for many years. CRH supports the Museum's Annual Maple Magic Week at the Bradley Museum, our On the Verandah summer concerts at Benares and so many other activities & fundraisers. CRH employees have given back to their local community for over 60 years.

This incredibly well organized Open House was a chance to learn about our local plant through a guided bus tour & informative displays. On the bus tour, we learned about the process of making cement from raw materials shipped to the plant's dock to the finished materials. Many of the displays were interactive. All ages but especially visiting children were fascinated by the big machines & exhibits.

We also learned about CRH's commitment to corporate social responsibility, safety and environmental policy. Enthusiastic employees outlined ways that they are continually reducing their environmental footprint.

The theme of this year's Open House was Climate Change, Sustainable Development and Biodiversity. We were treated to meeting human & animal representatives from Earth Rangers. The Credit Valley Conservation Authority was also on site. We learned about CRH's award nominated Flyway Habitat Restoration Project.

# WW1 Educational Day Benares Historic House September 24 & 25, 2018

Approximately 284 Grade 10 Peel students plus teaching staff explored the challenges and developments that individuals faced on the Home Front & fighting overseas during World War One through this amazing program. This program was organized & presented by the History Matters Association in partnership with the Museums of Mississauga. It was a hands-on experience as students were recruited into the Canadian Expeditionary Force.

The recruits rotated through stations that included: Remembering 11-11 A Poppy Activity, Battle School, Bayonet Drill, Stretcher Bearer, Rationing, Comfort Box, Military by Design, & A Virtual Cenotaph. The day came to a close with a First World War Fashion Show & Storming the Bunker. Students also learned about the tougher side of war, the harsh realities and why we must respect our veterans.

The poppies that students painted are part of a City Parks & Forestry plan to use ash from trees that fell due to the Emerald Ash Borer. The goal is to paint 1,111 wood poppies by Remembrance Day. They will be displayed in one large poppy & at the grave sites of veterans. The event is offered on two consecutive days this time each year & helps to bring WW1 Ontario Curriculum to life. ## **ENGAGEMENT AT BRADLEY 2018 -**ENGAGEMENT 1812 SEPTEMBER 15 - 16, 2018

Attending Engagement 1812 on the site of the Bradley Museum in Mississauga was a step back into the history of life in Upper Canada in the early 19th century. Each morning started with a flag raising at the Anchorage. There was a living camp, historic merchants, sutlers (a civilian merchant who sells provisions to an army in the field, in camp or in quarters from a wagon or a temporary tent), artisans and period cooking.

Demonstrations of military action reenacted the war that was declared between Great Britain & the United States in June of 1812.

Heritage Mississauga & Thompson's Company 2nd York Regiment hosted the event. A wide variety of groups attended the two day event including: The Incorporated Militia of Upper Canada, IMAC (Artillery), The Glengarry Light Infantry Fencibles, The Royal Navy, The Royal Scots Grenadiers, the British Indian Department, The US 23rd and many more. All of these groups generously volunteer, "a hobby with honour", their time to celebrate our history.

Each day featured several battles. The scrimmages were very well narrated. There were also musket demonstrations, marching drills, fifes and drums, authentic singers and dancers.

Congratulations to all who participated in this wonderful family event.


